Sharing strengths and finding inspiration beyond the Bull City border

Senior PharmAssist has been firmly rooted in Durham for 29 years. As we work with and serve our neighbors, others often ask us, "Why isn't there something like Senior PharmAssist where I live?" After all, the complicated healthcare and social care systems and rising costs are a challenge for older adults across the country.

A year ago, we began working with three other North Carolina counties that were interested in learning about the Senior PharmAssist model and how they might create a similar program in their own communities. With a grant from the Duke Roybal Center, National Institutes of Health, National Institute on Aging, and our colleagues at Duke, we provided training sessions, an online implementation manual, and coaching to healthcare and nonprofit leaders. This year, those communities are launching their own versions of our model and reporting back their own outcomes, so we can all learn from one another.

Another way Senior PharmAssist has extended its influence beyond our home in Durham is through the appointment of our ED, Gina Upchurch, to the MedPAC. The MedPAC is the Medicare Payment Advisory Commission, an independent congressional agency that advises the U.S. Congress on issues affecting the Medicare program. As a Commission member, Gina joins 16 other experts to discuss policies and procedures that affect the insurance options for Medicare beneficiaries. Gina carries all she learns from our Durham participants and their own struggles and successes to Washington D.C. to influence and inform these critical conversations.

This summer, our SHIIP (Seniors' Health Insurance Information Program) volunteers were honored with the **Governor's Award for Volunteer Service**. That's certainly true of our incredible SHIIP volunteers! They train hard, work hard, and make a real difference for folks navigating the complicated world of Medicare. This year, thanks to the generosity of our supporters and some of the new policies enacted in the Inflation Reduction Act, Senior PharmAssist has been able to **add new prescription medications to our formulary** (the list of drugs we help cover at the pharmacy). Now we can say "Yes, we cover that!" more often and for more people. One participant commented, "The program has helped me tremendously. I'm glad that they added Eliquis and Novolog - that really helped me, and I'm pleased with all the meds they have assisted me with."

VP Harris met with eight Senior PharmAssist participants and advocates during her visit, hearing their stories about how the changes to Medicare affect older adults in Durham.

The Inflation Reduction Act will reduce prices of critical life-saving drugs, cap out-of-pocket prescriptions, and negotiate some drug prices for Medicare beneficiaries. The resulting savings allowed us to expand our formulary and income guidelines, to cover more prescription medicines for more people.
